They join Ismael (third year graphic design), Josue (second year biochemical engineering), Yael (second year digital marketing) and Emmanuel (second year nutrition) all of whom advanced a year.

BACK TO SCHOOL

The schools in Mexico are still closed because of the pandemic.

However, the boys continue to learn through online classes or lessons that are aired on a television channel.

Our dedicated staff support the boys during the classes as well as with their homework assignments. This puts a lot more onus on the boys and our workers, but we are pleased to report that all have adapted well, and our students seem to be progressing academically.



We try to keep the boys busy and active while ensuring their safety within the confines of Refugio. A schedule has been implemented with exercises, online English classes (Duolingo), games and other activities in addition to their schooling and homework.

While frustration levels can sometimes be high, we are all learning how to live effectively in this new reality.



OUTINGS AND ACTIVITIES

A big part of the program for the boys involves activities and outings. It is even more important that we keep the boys challenged during these trying times.
