scenery, the boys have also undertaken several outings. They climb up El Faro regularly, observing the pandemic safety precautions of course. They have also been to local beaches where they exercise and play at a safe distance from other beach goers.

Ciudad de Los Niños invited the boys to use their outdoor facilities and take advantage of the large open space at

the home. They had a great time, happy to return to Refugio for a nap.
